

# Report of GISI webinar on Infections in IBD

The second GISI Webinar on "Infections in IBD" was a huge success with >500 participants and >200 live attendees. The webinar was also supported by the South Asian IBD Alliance. The webinar began with a talk on "Flares in mild to moderate UC: What's new?" by Dr Sumit Bhatia. This was followed by a talk on "Managing IBD associated opportunistic infections and cardiovascular risk" by Dr KT Shenoy.

Prof Bincy Abraham, from Houston Methodist, spoke on "Antibiotics for IBD." She mentioned the use of antibiotics in Crohn's disease, ulcerative colitis and pouchitis. The second talk was on "Assessing and managing risk of tuberculosis with biologics and small molecules" by Prof Vineet Ahuja from AIIMS, Delhi. He elaborated on evidence-based approach to latent tuberculosis in IBD patients planned for various IBD therapies. Dr Deepak Parakkal from Washington University of St Louis, spoke on "COVID vaccination in IBD" based on his experience gained from COVaRiPAD (COVID-19 Vaccine Responses in Patients with Autoimmune Disease) study. Prof Francis Farraye from Mayo Clinic Florida, spoke on "Routine vaccination in IBD" based on his long practical experience and provided insights on how vaccinations could be organized for patients in India.

#### **Society News**

Prof Sahil Khanna, co-editor-in-chief for JGI informed about the exciting changes forthcoming at the journal. Prof Chetana Vaishnavi informed that the webinars will be continued and the society will further increase its educational activities. In the meeting a guideline on "Vaccination in IBD for resource limited settings, including India" was announced which would be led by Dr Vishal Sharma. Prof Francis A Farraye agreed to provide help in organizing the guidelines with his extensive experience.
